STUDENTS ABROAD 2009-10

Total Number of UI Students Studying Abroad

- 1365 University of Iowa students studied, worked or conducted research abroad during 2009-10. This represents a 6.4% increase from the previous year when 1283 UI students studied abroad.
- 912 UI undergraduate students studied abroad, a 3.2% increase from 2008-09 (884).
- 453 UI graduate and professional students studied abroad, a 13.5% increase from 2008-09 (399).
- 45 students participated in 2 or more programs for a total of 1410 study abroad program participations.

Academic Status

- Of the UI students who studied abroad during 2009-10, 67% (912) were undergraduates and 33% (453) were graduate & professional students.
- Among the UI undergraduate degree candidates, < 1% were first-year students, 7% sophomores, 33% juniors and 59% seniors.

Duration of Study

- 36% of UI undergraduates participated in a summer program, 33% in a semester program, and 6% in an academic year program. 19% participated in winter session programs, and 6% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.
- 39% of UI graduate & professional students spent the summer abroad, 12% a semester, and 9% an academic year. 15% participated in winter session programs, and 25% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.

Destinations

- The 912 UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2009-10 did so in 53 different countries.
- The highest concentration of undergraduates—62%—was in Europe. 18% studied in Asia, 10% in Latin America, 5% in Oceania (Australia & New Zealand), and 5% in all other regions combined.
- The ten most popular undergraduate destinations were the United Kingdom (150), Spain (134), Italy (104), India (76), Japan (51), France (46), Australia (36), Greece (35), Germany (32), and China (25)/Ireland (25).
- The 453 UI graduate & professional students also studied (or conducted research) in 72 different countries. 45% studied in Europe, 28% in Latin America, 14% in Asia, and 13% in all other regions combined.
- UI students—undergraduate plus graduate & professional—studied or conducted research in 80 countries.

Field of Study & Participation Rates

- The undergraduates who studied abroad during 2009-10 had 67 different majors.
- 67% or undergraduate participants were from the College of Liberal Arts, 23% from the Tippie College of Business, 4% from the College of Education, 3% from the College of Engineering, and 2% from the College of Nursing.
- 4.4% of all UI undergraduate students studied abroad during 2009-10.
- Comparing the number of undergraduate degree candidates who studied abroad during 2009-10 (912) to the number of bachelor's degrees awarded by the UI during 2009-10 (4488) indicates that *approximately 20.3% of the current graduating class studied abroad.*
- Graduate & professional students came from the Graduate College (170), the MBA Program (149), Medicine (56), Law (44), Pharmacy (16), Public Health (15), and Dentistry (3).

Gender

- 64% (581) of the UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2009-10 were female. (In the fall semester 2009, 52% of all UI undergraduates were female.)
- 57% of graduate & professional students who studied abroad during 2009-10 were female. (In the fall semester 2009, 52% of all UI graduate & professional students were female.)

Ethnicity

- Information on ethnicity was reported by 92% of the undergraduate participants (837 of 912). 11.9% of these students were minority students (100 of 837). 32 were Hispanic/Latino(a), 43 Asian American, 18 African-American, 4 Native American, and 23 Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. (In the fall semester 2009, 10.1% of UI undergraduates were minority students.)
- Information on ethnicity was collected from 88% of the graduate and professional students (400 of 453). 14% of these students were minority students (56 of 400). (In the fall semester 2009, 10.7% of UI graduate and professional students were minorities.)

Resident and Non-Resident Participation

- 60% (550) of UI undergraduates abroad during 2009-10 were residents of Iowa; 40% (361) were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2009, 62% of all undergraduates were residents of Iowa.)
- 49% of the UI graduate & professional students who studied abroad were residents of Iowa; 51% were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2009, 52% of all graduate & professional students were residents of Iowa.)
- The 775 resident students represented 84 of Iowa's 99 counties. During the last 5 years, at least one student from each county has studied abroad.

GPA

- The average cumulative GPA of UI undergraduates who studied abroad was 3.29. [The UI mean was 2.98 (fall 09) and 3.00 (spring 10).] 76% had an average of 3.00 or higher; 47% had an average of 3.33 or higher.

Study Abroad Programs

- 1117 students participated in University of Iowa study abroad programs. This represents an increase of 20% from the previous year when 934 students participated in UI study abroad programs.
- 75% (680) of UI undergraduates who studied abroad participated in UI-sponsored or co-sponsored study abroad programs; 25% (232) participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities, exchange organizations, or foreign institutions.
- 96% of UI graduate and professional students participated in UI study abroad programs or conducted research independently; 4% participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities or foreign institutions.
- 25 non-degree undergraduate students and 74 non-degree graduate and professional students participated in study abroad programs administered by The University of Iowa. The Office for Study Abroad also administers three study abroad programs for the CIC, on which 38 students from the other CIC institutions participated. These students are enrolled at and will be counted by their respective institution.
