STUDENTS ABROAD 2008-09

Total Number of UI Students Studying Abroad

- 1283 University of Iowa students studied, worked or conducted research abroad during 2008-09. This represents a 5.3% increase from the previous year when 1218 UI students studied abroad.
- 884 UI undergraduate students studied abroad, a 3.6% increase from 2007-08 (853).
- 399 UI graduate and professional students studied abroad, a 9.3% increase from 2007-08 (365).
- 57 students participated in 2 or more programs for a total of 1343 study abroad experiences.

Academic Status

- Of the UI students who studied abroad during 2008-09, 69% (884) were undergraduates and 31% (399) were graduate & professional students.
- Among the UI undergraduate degree candidates, < 1% were first-year students, 11% sophomores, 36% juniors and 53% seniors.

Duration of Study

- 43% of UI undergraduates spent a semester abroad, 37% the summer, and 5% an entire academic year. 14% participated in winter session programs, and 1% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.
- 15% of UI graduate & professional students spent a semester abroad, 39% the summer, and 4% an academic year. 12% participated in winter session programs, and 30% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.

Destinations

- The 884 UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2008-09 did so in 60 different countries.
- The highest concentration of undergraduates—55%—was in Western Europe. 17% studied in Latin America, 11% in Asia, 8% in Oceania (Australia & New Zealand), and 9% in all other regions combined.
- The ten most popular undergraduate destinations were the United Kingdom (147), Spain (125), Italy (73), Australia (56), Germany (48), China (46), France (44), India (41), Japan (39), and Mexico (24)/Ireland (24).
- The 399 UI graduate & professional students also studied (or conducted research) in 61 different countries. 30% studied in Western Europe, 25% in Latin America, 23% in Asia, and 22% in all other regions combined.

Field of Study

- The undergraduates who studied abroad during 2008-09 had 60 different majors. 70% were from the College of Liberal Arts, 19% from the Tippie College of Business, 4% from the College of Education, 4% from the College of Engineering, and 3% from the College of Nursing.
- 4.2% of all UI undergraduate students studied abroad during 2008-09.
- Comparing the number of undergraduate degree candidates who studied abroad during 2008-09 (884) to the number of bachelor's degrees awarded by the UI during 2007-08 (4482) indicates that *approximately 19.7% of the current graduating class studied abroad.*
- Graduate & professional students came from the Graduate College (178), the MBA Program (94), Medicine (54), Law (37), Pharmacy (19), Public Health (14), and Dentistry (3).

Gender

- 68% (600) of the UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2008-09 were female. (In the fall semester 2008, 52% of all UI undergraduates were female.)
- 59% of graduate & professional students who studied abroad during 2008-09 were female. (In the fall semester 2008, 51% of all UI graduate & professional students were female.)

Ethnicity

- Information on ethnicity was reported by 96% of the undergraduate participants (845 of 884). 10.2% of these students were minority students (86 of 845). 19 were Hispanic/Latino(a), 48 Asian/Pacific Islander, 16 African-American/Black, and 3 Native American. (In the fall semester 2008, 9.2% of UI undergraduates were minority students.)
- Information on ethnicity was collected from 93% of the graduate and professional students (372 of 399). 12.6% of these students were minority students (47 of 372). (In the fall semester 2008, 10.4% of UI graduate and professional students were minorities.) An additional 11% were international students.

Resident and Non-Resident Participation

- 60% (532) of UI undergraduates abroad during 2008-09 were residents of Iowa; 40% (352) were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2008, 63% of all undergraduates were residents of Iowa.)
- 53% of the UI graduate & professional students who studied abroad were residents of Iowa; 47% were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2008, 53% of all graduate & professional students were residents of Iowa.)
- The 743 resident students represented 85 of Iowa's 99 counties.

GPA

- The average cumulative GPA of UI undergraduates who studied abroad was 3.30. [The UI mean was 2.96 (fall 07) and 3.00 (spring 08).] 78% had an average of 3.00 or higher; 49% had an average of 3.33 or higher.

Study Abroad Programs

- 899 students participated in 80 study abroad programs offered by The University of Iowa. This represents an increase of 1% from the previous year when 890 students participated in UI study abroad programs.
- 62% (550) of UI undergraduates who studied abroad participated in UI-sponsored or co-sponsored study abroad programs; 38% (334) participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities, exchange organizations, or foreign institutions.
- 96% of UI graduate and professional students participated in UI study abroad programs or conducted research independently; 4% participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities or foreign institutions.
- 26 non-degree undergraduate students and 16 non-degree graduate and professional students participated in study abroad programs administered by The University of Iowa.
- The Office for Study Abroad administers three study abroad programs for the CIC, on which 101 students from the other CIC institutions participated. These students are enrolled at and will be counted by their respective institutions.
