## **Eligibility**

---

University of Iowa students who are planning to study abroad and who identify with groups traditionally underrepresented in study abroad programs are encouraged to apply for a Diversity Ambassador Scholarship. Recipients of the Diversity Ambassador Scholarship who apply for other awards may receive need-based grants or merit-based scholarships concurrently.

## **Expectations**

---

Part of being a Diversity Ambassador includes being a face for the life-changing experience one gains through study abroad. Recipients are asked to write an open letter to prospective students and provide 2-5 photos for the website upon their return.

Study Abroad hosts student panels and information sessions throughout the year and anticipates that you will share your experiences by participating in one of our events. Additionally, Diversity Ambassadors are strongly encouraged to share their experiences with Study Abroad and prospective students by engaging with our social media pages, blogging from abroad, and/or submitting photos/video to use in promotional materials.

## **Deadlines**

## **Selection Process**

---

Applications will be reviewed by a Scholarship Committee and processed through Study Abroad in UI International Programs. All applicants will be notified of results via email at the conclusion of the process, several weeks after the application deadline.
