STUDENTS ABROAD 2010-11

Total Number of UI Students Studying Abroad

- 1347 University of Iowa students studied, worked or conducted research abroad during 2010-11. This represents a 1.3% decrease from the previous year when 1365 UI students studied abroad.
- 908 UI undergraduate students studied abroad, a .4% decrease from 2009-10 (912).
- 439 UI graduate and professional students studied abroad, a 3.1% decrease from 2009-10 (453).
- 31 students participated in 2 or more programs for a total of 1378 study abroad program participations.

Academic Status

- Of the UI students who studied abroad during 2010-11, 67% (908) were undergraduates and 33% (439) were graduate & professional students.
- Among the UI undergraduate degree candidates, < 1% were first-year students, 8% sophomores, 32% juniors and 59% seniors.

Duration of Study

- 36% of UI undergraduates participated in a summer program, 41% in a semester program, and 5% in an academic year program. 16% participated in winter session programs, and 2% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.
- 40% of UI graduate & professional students spent the summer abroad, 17% a semester, and 3% an academic year. 23% participated in winter session programs, and 17% in other short-term programs of 3 weeks or less.

Destinations

- UI students—undergraduate plus graduate & professional—studied or conducted research in 81 countries.
- The 908 UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2010-11 did so in 58 different countries.
- The highest concentration of undergraduates—58%—was in Europe. 18% studied in Asia, 10% in Latin America, 6% in Oceania (Australia & New Zealand), and 8% in all other regions combined.
- The ten most popular undergraduate destinations were Italy (157), the United Kingdom (123), Spain (106), India (88), Australia (45), Germany (42), China (40), France (38), Ireland (27), and Japan/Mexico (26).
- The 439 UI graduate & professional students also studied (or conducted research) in 65 different countries. 35% studied in Latin America, 34% in Europe, 21% in Asia, and 10% in all other regions combined.

Field of Study & Participation Rates

- The undergraduates who studied abroad during 2010-11 had 71 different majors.
- 67.5% of undergraduate participants were from the College of Liberal Arts, 22% from the Tippie College of Business, 4.5% from the College of Education, 4.4% from the College of Engineering, 1.4% from the College of Nursing, and .2% from University College.
- 4.3% of all UI undergraduate students studied abroad during 2010-11.
- Comparing the number of undergraduate degree candidates who studied abroad during 2010-11 (908) to the number of bachelor's degrees awarded by the UI during 2010-11 (4537) indicates that *approximately 20% of the current graduating class studied abroad.*
- Graduate & professional students came from the Graduate College (190), the MBA Program (109), Medicine (60), Law (39), Pharmacy (27), Public Health (14), and Dentistry (4). (Total 443 includes 4 students majoring in 2 colleges.)

Gender

- 68% (615) of the UI undergraduates who studied abroad during 2010-11 were female. (In the fall semester 2010, 52% of all UI undergraduates were female.)

- 52% (228) of graduate & professional students who studied abroad during 2010-11 were female. (In the fall semester 2010, 51% of all UI graduate & professional students were female.)

Ethnicity

- Information on ethnicity was reported by 94% (849) of the undergraduate participants. 11% (93) of these students were minority students. 22 were Hispanic/Latino(a), 32 Asian American, 28 African-American, 10 Native American, and 1 Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. (In the fall semester 2010, 11% of UI undergraduates were minority students.)
- Information on ethnicity was collected from 91% (398) of the graduate and professional students. 19% (75) of these students were minority students. (In the fall semester 2010, 11% of UI graduate and professional students were minorities.)

Resident and Non-Resident Participation

- 55% (498) of UI undergraduates abroad during 2010-11 were residents of Iowa; 45% (410) were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2010, 59% of all undergraduates were residents of Iowa.)
- 49% of the UI graduate & professional students who studied abroad were residents of Iowa; 51% were non-residents. (In the fall semester 2010, 52% of all graduate & professional students were residents of Iowa.)
- The 714 resident students represented 79 of Iowa's 99 counties. During the last 6 years, at least one student from each county has studied abroad.

GPA

- The average cumulative GPA of UI undergraduates who studied abroad was 3.28. [The UI mean was 2.98 (fall 10) and 3.00 (spring 11).] 75% had an average of 3.00 or higher; 47% had an average of 3.33 or higher.

Study Abroad Programs

- 1715 students, including non-degree participants from other institutions, participated in University of Iowa study abroad programs.
- 73% (663) of UI undergraduates who studied abroad participated in UI-sponsored or co-sponsored study abroad programs; 27% (245) participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities, exchange organizations, or foreign institutions.
- 99% (435) of UI graduate and professional students participated in UI study abroad programs or conducted research independently; 1% (4) participated in programs offered by other U.S. universities or foreign institutions.
- 464 non-degree undergraduate students and 85 non-degree graduate and professional students participated in study abroad programs administered by The University of Iowa. The Office for Study Abroad also administers three study abroad programs for the CIC, on which 68 students from the other CIC institutions participated. These students were enrolled at and will be counted by their respective institutions.
